

Trades Training Opportunity

Who can apply?

Open to all Northern Residents of Saskatchewan

What kind of training?: Trades initiative looks at three particular trades in demand in the Alberta Oil and Gas sector, Welding, Pipefitting, and Electrician. The 16 week program is divided into 2 phases one seven week segment that will be offered in Buffalo Narrow, SK this segment will prepare you to challenge the Alberta trades entrance exam it and will consist of the following:

Saskatchewan Phase 1

1 week Employment Readiness

5 weeks Academic study specific to the Alberta Trades entrance exam Math, science

1 week Safety tickets mandatory attendance is required. No exceptions

*****Min 70% to pass Saskatchewan phase required*****

Alberta Phase 2 (8 Weeks):

Challenge the Alberta Trades Entrance Exam. **Min pass requirement 70%

Hands on portion will be at a site location in Alberta North of Fort Mc Murray

Transportation from a central Saskatchewan location, camp accommodation, and meals will be provided to all participants at no charge, as part of the program.

While on site North of Fort Mc Murray you will be training in the NAIT training in motion mobile units on site, the schedules are designed like shift work two weeks in one week out. Each 2 wks in you will focus specifically on one trade and attain valuable hands on training. Upon successful completion of the course we will work with the on site coordinators and on site contractors to help try and secure employment and apprenticeship opportunities for each student.
